  An online prevention project against child pornography by DSWD to empower children, parents / guardians, and other child-duty bearers.
- 3 SaferKidsPH
  A 6-year program that aims to reduce incidents of online sexual abuse and expatiation by strengthening the child protection system.

#### ACCEPTABLE USAGE OF THE FREE WIFI

- Creation of positive online content for children or sites where they are free from threats of inappropriate content:
- Promotion of the use of the free public internet as an educational resource for all.

#### UNACCEPTABLE USAGE OF THE FREE WIFI

- Access to child-inappropriate content or materials;
- Hacking, phishing, spamming;
- Any forms of discrimination, threats, harassment;
- Cyberbullying;
- Online gambling;
- Copyright infringement;
- All other unlawful use.

## What is the Child Online Safety Policy?

The Child Online Safeguarding Policy (COSP) provides guidelines, mechanisms, and standards for the safeguarding and protection of children and young generation users of the Free Internet Access in Public Places (FIAPP) from all harms of the internet, such as online gambling, child pornography, and child online abuse and sexual exploitation.



### Who is protected by COSP?

According to R.A. 7610 Sec. 3, COSP aims to protect minors under the age of 18. These minors are classified into the following:



### Children

Ages 12 years old and below



### Teens

Ages 13 years old and above
